He also obtained his Certification in Risk Management Assurance from IIA Inc USA.

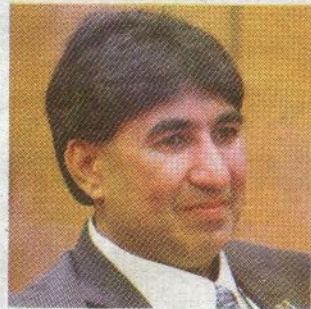
